Then Jamie won the doubles with a non-speaking English partner winning the doubles 6/4, 6/2. He had to communicate by google translate and put it into Flemish.

In the second tournament Jamie was playing in Germany and won the 12&under singles fairly comfortably only dropping 12 games in 5 matches. In that same tournament he was playing 14&under and made semi-final and lost to the number 11 in Germany for 14s 7/6, 6/7, 7/6.

In the 3rd tournament Jamie was playing a 12&under in Germany still but he was playing a category 1 which is the best tournament you can find making quarterfinals and losing to the number 1 from Russia 7/5, 6/4.He came 3rd in doubles with an English partner losing to the number 1 and 7 in Germany 7/6, 6/7, 10/8.

Last tournament he was playing 12&under in category 1 and he had to play the number 2 in Germany first round and beat him 6/4 6/4 to go on and make quarters and lost to the number 1 Romanian 6/1, 4/6, 6/3.
