We have carefully unpacked the Ministry of Education guidelines for the Red setting. It is great we are going to be able to have all students onsite every day for their learning. Some of the procedures that worked really well last year remain in place - classroom ventilation, teaching outdoors when possible and mask wearing indoors.

Under the Red setting we are able to run our timetable. I'm stoked about this, as it is the Ponsonby specialist teaching model that really makes this school exciting for students.

Today is our Teacher Only Day and uniform sales finished at 2pm. From Tuesday 1 February uniforms are available from 3pm each afternoon from the office.

Events and Activities

Large gatherings indoors continue to be one of the riskier activities we can undertake. Therefore we have reviewed some of the events and activities for the upcoming term to ensure we meet the health guidance for the Red setting.

- Our Term 1 EOTC trips are postponed until the Orange setting.
- Meet the Teacher evening remains Wednesday 2nd February via Zoom, your child's form teacher will send you a link on Tuesday.
- Some in-school activities will be spilt into geographical zones.

Face Coverings

Public health advice is that an appropriate face covering should fit snugly and seal well around facial contours. This can include single use, disposable masks (medical masks) and re-usable fabric masks with three layers.

Don't worry if you don't have these specific types of face coverings, as public health experts also say that any face covering is better than no face covering.

The Unite Against COVID-19 website also has information on <u>how to make a face covering</u>. Some children may be reluctant to wear a face covering, however one way of looking at it is: *just like you need to wear a hat outside, you need to wear a mask inside.*

Managing cases in our school

We have good contact tracing systems in place so that if there is a confirmed case who has been at school while infectious, we can quickly identify who was a close contact of that person. We will then quickly advise those contacts of what they need to do.

Only if the Ministry of Health or the Ministry of Education advises to do so, would we consider closing the school and moving to distance learning for everyone. At Red we will keep everyone learning onsite for as long as we can.

Please make sure your contact details we have on file are up to date, so we can get in touch with you if needed.

The First Day of School, Tuesday 1st February

Year 8 students know their Form class, they need to enter the school at 8:35am and head straight to their room. New Year 8 students to our school, please meet at the school office at 8:20am.

Year 7 students please come to school at **8:45am**. You will all need to meet on the basketball court in the centre of the school. Most students know where the covered basketball court is (hence the uniform sales in the Hall). We will also have some ushers helping you out too.

A huge amount of effort has gone into the class placements process. Katie Fiddian and Rachel Maitland Smith have gathered information from parents, children and the primary schools and worked over the summer to build ten balanced Year 7 classes.

It is more than likely your child will come home tired and with a bit of 'information overload" over the first few days. My first day tip is; *it is always a good move to have lemonade ice blocks handy!* This has been proven by experts to be soothing for children.

The Ministry of Education has some helpful information on their <u>Parents and Whānau website</u> to support your tamariki to get back to school. There is also a very important reminder about how you can<u>take care of yourself</u>.

While this might all feel a little overwhelming at times, we know that all these measures will help our children return to school, reconnect with whānau and friends and do what they enjoy.
