



Archery

Year 7 student Simon Atkinson (Room 11) is part of the Mountain Green Archery Club in Mount Albert and the Massey Archery Club in Kumeu. He recently competed in the Auckland District

Archery Association's 2022 Field Championships, hosted by Lakeview Archers next to Lake Karapiro, Cambridge. This was Simon's first competition using a compound bow - he used to use a recurve bow, but switched a few months ago. Simon likes to do field archery, which is out in the bush and done in small groups, a bit like golf. For this event, competitors move around a specific course and shoot at targets with the first round shooting at round targets and second round shooting at animal 3D targets (see photos). Placings are based on a points system and Simon gained 471 points to come 2nd overall in his division of Cub Male Compound. Awesome shooting Simon, especially when some targets were unmarked and making split second judgements on distances were called for.
