While the teachers are incredibly busy (as always) they are also preparing


mid-year school the reports. These will be sent by email on the last day of the term.

Vaping in Schools

We have seen an increase in vaping across New Zealand schools this year. Students are finding a number of ways to get hold of a vaping device.

We have serious consequences for vaping at Ponsonby Intermediate and if a student is in possession of a vape.

The SchoolTV report below is a useful resource for parents and caregivers to provide some knowledge and guidance around this current issue.

SPECIAL REPORT: Vaping

Over recent months, there has been a growing concern about the impending epidemic affecting young people in relation to the use of e-cigarettes and the trendy pastime of vaping. As this activity grows in popularity, most teenagers are unaware of the associated risks and the potential impact vaping can have on their development and overall health.

Vaping is the inhaling of a vapour created by an electronic cigarette, better known as an ecigarette. E-cigarettes are battery-powered smoking devices containing cartridges filled with a liquid that usually contains nicotine, flavourings and chemicals. This liquid is heated into a vapour and is then inhaled by the user, hence the term "vaping."

Vaping puts nicotine into the body and is highly addictive. It is still unknown what the long-term effects are of vaping, but short-term we do know that it can slow down brain development in kids and teens. This can then affect their memory, concentration, learning, self-control, attention and mood. E-cigarettes also irritate and damage the lungs and can entice the use of other forms of tobacco, such as cigarettes.

Attempts are being made to regulate vaping and ban the importation of vape products containing nicotine. Unfortunately, manufacturers are developing vaping devices that are cheaper and easier to hide than conventional cigarettes, making it more attractive and cost-effective for impressionable young people.

They can also access these notices through their google account.

These Daily Notices have everything from sports, trials, auditions, leadership meetings, new activities or groups, learning programmes and many more things. We also use the Daily Notices to remind students about school rules and areas that students may need to work on such as road safety or bus behaviour.

Devices at school – Computers and Phones

A reminder to parents: all student phones are to be handed in to the Form Teacher at the beginning of the day, no exceptions.

If your child chooses to bring a device to school for their learning such as a laptop this also needs to be handed in to their Form Teacher. We have a clear system in place to look after these devices and do not what phones or laptops to be in students bags during the school day.

Jazz School and School holiday Big Band workshop


