Principal's Message

Term 3 is academic moving time. All students have completed their 3 minute speeches, and the 12 students who delivered their speeches in front of the whole school on Friday were awesome. Now, students in Year 8 are moving on with Character Novel Studies and our Year 7's have started the Short Story unit of work. In Maths, all classes continue with the Pr1me problem solving approach and DEEP Learning has a focus on Geometry, via a lens of cultural significance. Our Mathex students who have been training for months will compete next week and large numbers of students are completing their ICAS exams.

Over the past few weeks, many students have been awarded new Leadership positions - Eco Warriors, Councillors, Cultural Leaders, Sports Leaders, Tech Experts, Librarians, Positively Ponsonby Reps and Recreation Team Leaders. The school is proud to be able to offer so many leadership opportunities.

On Friday, our 530 students and 40 visitors from Korea completed the Cross Country - a fabulous way to end a busy week. The top eight in each category will be out representing Ponsonby next week.

We have record numbers of students participating in weekly sports -Basketball, Netball, Water Polo and Hockey. Having 17 Basketball teams and 11 Netball teams means over 230 students being actively involved each week in those two codes alone! Basketball is also the lunchtime inter-class competition this term, I love the large supportive crowds these games generate almost daily.

Next Friday is the Cancer Society's national Daffodil Day. We have many plans organised to raise students' awareness around this heartfelt topic - dressing in yellow and green is encouraged.

Performance Evening is made up of aspects from Talent Quest, Production, Roadshow and our Cultural groups, we expect over 120 students to be taking the stage, please come along - Wednesday 6 September at 7pm. We also have our Art Exhibition Open Evening we would like to invite you to - Wednesday 20 September 3:20pm - 6pm. Thank you for the large turn out to our Camp Information Evening, we have many, many volunteers this year, which is fantastic, as Camps are not possible without your support.

School TV: Dealing with Disappointment

As young people learn to navigate through various aspects of their life, they may face disappointment due to unfulfilled expectations, shattered dreams, or unexpected setbacks. Yet, with the appropriate tools, strategies, and a positive mindset, young people can learn to cope with disappointment and use it as an opportunity for personal growth and success.

Disappointment can be a tricky emotion to deal with at any age. It is a normal part of growing up. However, children sometimes need reminding that they have a choice in how they respond to disappointment and their response will determine the impact it has on their future happiness. Overall, disappointment is a healthy and positive emotion and plays an integral part in a child's emotional, intellectual and social development.

Helping young people manage their disappointment is important in order to avoid stronger emotions such as anxiety and depression. Although a parent's first reaction may be to fix the problem, it is better to encourage your child to find the words to express how they feel.

In this Special Report, parents and caregivers are provided with strategies on how to help their child process disappointment and look at the problem objectively.

We hope you take time to reflect on the information offered in this Special Report, and as always, we welcome your feedback.
