Student Online Conduct

Over the past few weeks there has been an increase in online behaviour that has raised concerns. We would like to remind parents and caregivers that social media websites cannot be accessed through the school internet nor can students access them on their phones during school time as they must be handed in at 8:30am.

We ask that parents and guardians monitor their child's behaviour online outside of school hours. The school has limited authority to shut down or control online content as we all know from our own experiences. If the online behaviour seriously impacts a child, we have an obligation to take some form of action when it is brought to our attention and when it is affecting the student's ability to feel safe at school.

If you are concerned about behaviour online or a chat group that your child has joined, the below steps may provide some guidance around what are some of the things you can do:

- Remove yourself from the chat group
- Block the person
- Take a screenshot of the message/comment as it can be used as evidence if the harassment or bullying continues
- Don't reply
- Tell a trusted adult
- Report to Netsafe if it is of a threatening or harmful nature <u>https://report.netsafe.org.nz/hc/en-au/requests/new</u>

We will continue to educate students around sensible online behaviour. This week we have form time lessons focusing on how to be safe online as well as a whole school talk from an outside agency called Attitude where the topic was "Tackling Technology".
