ASB Polyfest celebrates Auckland's youth and cultural diversity with speech, song and dance. Through competitive and non-competitive sections, Auckland secondary school students prepare traditional speech and performances that are aligned to the festival's theme for the year, with compositions to fit aspects of their respective culture. With six stages to choose from (Māori, Samoa, Tonga, Niue, Cook Islands, Diversity), ASB Polyfest is one of the largest cultural festivals in the world.

This year ASB Polyfest is providing a specialised programme for Primary/Intermediate students (Years 4-8) to experience the festival on Wednesday 20 March 2024. Schools Day Programme allows for students to participate in fun, interactive, educational activation workshops – hosted by education institutions, government organisations, community groups, and creative industries; learn about the different cultures that are part of ASB Polyfest; and see performances and speeches in action.

To maintain the high standard of facilities and the educational opportunities/programmes our school now offers, it is necessary to supplement the grant we receive from the Ministry of Education with specific funding via student costs. The Ministry of Education grant does not provide for any of the 'extras' or 'frills' of the educational programme/resources we provide.

We are very aware of the expenses facing parents/caregivers at the beginning of the school year. We have therefore tried to keep costs as low as possible. We are also aware that schools have a terrible habit of asking for money throughout the year for various reasons and know that this becomes an inconvenience for parents/caregivers.

For 2024 we pledge that the total cost asked for now will cover all costs for the entire year's activities/trips with the exception of the Term 4 Class Camp. However there are additional costs for activities such as – Ski Team, Hockey, Netball, Basketball, ICAS exam etc...

Yes, that is correct! We will not ask for money for trips, fundraising activities, educational excursions etc...

Below is a breakdown of costs. The total amount is \$580.00 for the year or \$145.00 per term.

We thank you for your support and trust this format of payment makes it easier for you.

Activity costs are expenses that all schools would collect at the beginning of the year and for such things as Special Events/Trips, Special Programmes, etc. and throughout the year as events occur.

School Donation is optional although we obviously encourage you to pay this and appreciate it greatly if you do. School Donations can be claimed back on your annual tax return.

School TV – School Refusal

In this edition of SchoolTV - SCHOOL REFUSAL


School refusal, sometimes called school avoidance or school phobia, is not uncommon. It is different to 'wagging' or truancy and is often related to worry or anxiety-related issues about going to school. School refusal may start gradually or happen suddenly. Although it is normal for a child to occasionally miss a day of school, parents should only be concerned if a child regularly complains about feeling sick or often asks to stay home due to minor physical complaints.

School refusal is a complex issue as there is rarely a single cause. It affects children of all ages across primary and secondary levels. It can often occur during times of transition at school. More recently, the Coronavirus pandemic has disrupted the educational experience of all students, affecting some more than others. Dealing with a school refusal child can affect the whole family, adding pressure to an already challenging time. School refusal is not considered a formal psychiatric diagnosis. It's a name given to an emotional and/or behavioural problem. In this edition of SchoolTV, adult carers will learn how best to approach this issue and work towards a solution.

We hope you take time to reflect on the information offered in this edition of SchoolTV and we always welcome your feedback. If you have any concerns about your child, please contact the school counsellor for further information or seek medical or professional help.
