

Puberty Education – Health Classes

Starting Term 3, Year 7 and 8 Health teachers Ms Murray and Miss Brittin will be presenting lessons with a focus on Relationships, Puberty and Body Systems. Updated resources - Navigating The Journey, Relationships and Sexuality Education (RSE) Years 1-8 align well to assist with the delivery of this programme, including online educational materials for Body Systems. The learning outcomes for this unit will enable students to work towards achievement of *Health and Physical Education* guidelines mentioned in the *New Zealand Curriculum*. This programme reinforces information Year 8 students learnt last year more indepth, and will introduce key concepts to Year 7 students. Students will learn about:

- Establishing a positive Learning Environment.
- Who am I? Respect for self and others.
- Relationships: Relationships and their qualities.
- Growing and Changing: The physical, mental and emotional, social, and spiritual growth, and development that occurs and the new needs that arise during puberty.
- Decision Making: Strategies to manage the changes students will experience.
- Staying safe: Support people.
- The Body Systems research project to explore the main systems and functions.


We encourage all students to participate and those students who are unable to compete due to sickness or injury, must bring a note to their form teacher on the day.


