At lunchtime, the wild rain did not deter students from racing towards the panikeke being sold to raise money for the Pasifika group costumes, and the 300 panikeke were sold out in ten minutes. A very special thank you to Vaitoelau Fanene for the hours she has given the students to teach them Samoan songs, dances and values.

Board of Trustee Elections

In September this year the school board will be running elections, as we do every 3 years. As part of the planning for this the school board will be meeting to consider whether or not to introduce Staggered (Mid-term) elections. If adopted the school would elect half of the parent representatives for an 18 month term, and run an additional mid-term election in 18 months' time. The impact of this would be a staggered turnover of parent representatives (each committing to a 3 Year tenure), and a more frequent election cycle that would more closely represent the tenure of students at our school.


