Principal's Message

Over the past fortnight, students at Ponsonby have enthusiastically engaged in a range of academic challenges, including Speeches, Mathex, ICAS Exams, Chess and Bandquest. These events are valuable opportunities for students to showcase their learning and often contribute to building confidence and self-esteem. While such activities are typically considered summative assessments evaluating what students have learnt, we also place a strong emphasis on assessments for learning, which focus on the learning process itself.

A great example of this was the recent Student Led Conferences, where students shared their learning journey and identified their next steps. Our specialist teaching model supports this by allowing teachers to use their subject expertise to create meaningful learning experiences and provide targeted feedback. We expect and encourage our students to be able to clearly articulate their learning goals and progress.

Last week, 22 students travelled to Wellington on the 'Our Capital City' trip. They had a fantastic experience and represented our school with pride. In fact, several members of the public reached out to commend them on their outstanding behaviour - especially during the 11 hour train ride home. Well done!

Congratulations to all our Netball players on a fantastic season! A huge thank you goes to our dedicated coaches and managers, your time and support are truly appreciated and vital to our success.

Yesterday, the ballot for Out-of-Zone placement for 2026 was drawn. This marks an important step in preparing for a smooth transition from primary to intermediate school. 
We also ask that you do not use the staff car park in the mornings.

The fee for attending camp this year is \$350 for Year 7 and \$420 Year 8. This amount can be paid online using the link below or at the front office.


